Sex Trade Survivors Justice Act

SECTION 1. Definitions.

"Prostituted person" shall mean any person who has been subjected to prostitution because such person: (i) is the victim of the crime of sexual servitude pursuant to [insert criminal code section]; (ii) is the victim of the crime of sex trafficking as defined in 22 U.S.C. 7105; (iii) engages, agrees to engage or offers to engage in sexual conduct with another person in return for a fee, in violation of subsection [insert criminal code section], or in exchange for food, shelter, clothing, education or care.

SECTION 2. All monies used or intended to be used to facilitate any violation of [relevant procurement, promoting prostitution or patronizing prostitution statutes] that are not provided as restitution to victims shall be transmitted monthly by the courts to the state treasurer who shall then allocate the funds to the [State/Commonwealth] Office for Victim Assistance who shall, in turn, allocate the funds to the Victims of Human Trafficking Trust Fund.

SECTION 3. Whoever patronizes or receives compensation for soliciting for a prostituted person, except a prostituted person who is solicited, shall be punished by imprisonment in a house of correction for not more than two and one-half years, or by a fine of not less than \$1,000 and not more than \$5,000 or by both such imprisonment and fine.

SECTION 4. Persons who with offensive and disorderly acts or language accost or annoy another person, lewd, wanton and lascivious persons in speech or behavior, keepers of noisy and disorderly houses, and persons guilty of indecent exposure, shall be punished by imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more than 6 months, or by a fine of not more than \$200, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5.

- (a) The court shall order an expungement pursuant to this section of a record created as a result of a criminal court appearance, juvenile court appearance or dispositions for charges of common street walking, under [insert criminal code section], and for charges of sexual conduct with another person in return for a fee under [insert criminal code section].
- (b) The court shall forward an order for expungement pursuant to this section forthwith to the clerk of the court where the record was created, pursuant to [relevant section of law].
