


Can we please chat about Roblox? My daughter (10) sometimes goes on and plays with one particular friend and they basically walk around and do silly things like get a job and hang out at each other's houses. I'm always listening and she's really open about what she's doing.

I also know there is a dark side of Roblox and I just want to be fully informed because I don't understand the game or what to watch for, what's safe and what isn't.

Then there is also the concerns about the location sharing and such, but I think that would be easier to turn off.

Even with chat turned off, there are no guarantees of safety with user generated content.

Characters can appear naked, acting sexually, offering drugs via on screen edits such as signs, signage, clothing.

With millions of games accessible within Roblox, there is a lot of unknown and uncontrollable content. The parental safety settings are a false sense of security in something like this.



I learned something about Roblox chat today, and wanted to share – it may or may not have been shared before. I'm not looking for advice, just an FYI if your kid(s) play Roblox with chat disabled.

My preteen plays with the chat feature turned off completely (and it is password protected). They were away from home recently, and I noticed an unknown person in their text messages. In talking with my child, I found out that the game Brookhaven has "signs" where you can type whatever you want. So the other person was able to give their phone number & name & location, they were able to chat using this sign, and exchange personal info. As you may know, there is no chat log or history to view conversations held within the games, and there appear to be other ways to chat, regardless of the settings.

Monitor and talk to your kiddos OFTEN! Disabling something does not make it impossible to do, or mean that they won't find a work-around! Make sure they repeatedly hear why something is a rule, especially when it's for their safety.

Roblox opinions needed!

I have a 7 year old and 10.5 year old petitioning for Roblox, partially because we have / make a lot of traveling-family friends, and some of the kids use Roblox as a way to stay connected as they move around the world.

We already started on Minecraft 2 years ago for the same reasons, but the staying-in-touch part of it faded pretty quickly, and then we were left with kids who love Minecraft (which I actually didn't mind overall - we only allow creative mode, and if behavior goes downhill because it becomes addictive, we just cold-turkey stop for a while).

I see a lot of value in Minecraft - my older girl could easily go into interior design or architecture one day, and I see the creativity and thought she puts into it - on other days, she's doing the same thing with LEGO.

But I'm not seeing the same value in Roblox so far, from my research. I also have much bigger concerns about safety for them. But I don't know if those are exaggerated, or if the parents who allow Roblox (especially for younger kids) just aren't aware of the possible risks. Or if I don't understand how real the risks really are.

But if the reason for Roblox is to play with friends, then you'd need the Chat function, and a) that seems dicey, and b) my 7 year old would need a lot of help from us to write messages, and I don't want them going down that texting-with-friends road yet, as we aren't there yet!

They only use our devices, they don't have any iPads or phones of their own.

The chat features are not the only aspect of Roblox that makes it unsafe. Roblox is a free-for-all in terms of the games that can be accessed. They are user created, and often have questionable content (my 12 year old had Roblox a few months ago. He played twice, then never again. He had a job dancing in a bar for money so that he could buy anything he wanted, including firearms. I have heard of kids being exposed to porn through Roblox because the games created on the platform have sexual content. Roblox claims to shut those games down "quickly", but the fact that they can ever be accessed at all is not good enough for me to even consider it as a safe option.


